Selections Made for Beach and Rose Hall District Vacancies

City Council recently selected two appointees for the Beach and Rose Hall District seats, both of whom will serve until the special election is held in November.

Beach District - Guy King Tower. Tower is a retired lawyer, mediator, educator and association executive and will fill the vacant Beach District seat.

Rose Hall District - Michael Berlucchi. Berlucchi is a community engagement manager for Norfolk's Chrysler Museum, and a member of the Human Rights Commission and the Virginia Beach Community Development Corporation.

Rose Hall School Board Seat Filled

A candidate unanimously selected for the City's School Board Rose Hall District seat withdrew his name after inappropriate social media posts surfaced. The board accepted the withdrawal and on May 28, in a 6-3 vote, selected Jessica Owens. She will serve until the November election.

Virginia Beach Public Works is holding a series of public meetings to consider the City's options, help citizens determine their flood risk and learn what residents can do on their own to help protect themselves and their property.



The rate of relative sea level rise (SLR) in Hampton Roads is within the top 10 percent of the nation, primarily due to the relatively high rate of subsidence in Hampton Roads. The trend of SLR increase is expected to continue and is projected to accelerate through the end of the century.

Hurricane Season Is Here

The 2019 Atlantic hurricane season, which begins on June 1 and ends in November, is expected to be a "near normal" season. An average year is considered to have 12 named storms and six hurricanes. Residents can start preparing for hurricane season by:



--Know your evacuation zone by visiting www.KnowYourZoneVA.org "Know Your Zone" is a program to streamline evacuation efforts in the event a powerful hurricane passes over Hampton Roads.

--Consider getting flood insurance, which is separate from homeowners insurance. Virginia Beach was recently accepted into FEMA's [National Flood Insurance Program](http://www.fema.gov/national-flood-insurance-program) which decreases flood insurance premiums for those who qualify.

--Develop an emergency plan and get FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) updates by downloading the mobile app at www.fema.gov/mobile-app

--Make a disaster supply kit with enough to live without power or running water for at least three days. Supplies include nonperishable food, bottled water, medicine, a flashlight and batteries, a radio, hygiene supplies and a first-aid kit.

Parents should have enough diapers and baby formula for their infants and don't forget about supplies for pets. For a full checklist, visit www.VAemergency.com/emergency-kit

--In the event of an evacuation, carry a supply kit in your vehicle that includes critical documents such as Social Security cards, passports, copies of prescriptions and insurance forms. Whether staying or going, carrying cash is a good idea as the region could lose power and credit cards and ATMs may not work for days after a storm.
